

The files of the Passport Office, United States Department of State, reviewed by a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on October 23, 1967, disclose that Ruben Salazar was issued Passport Number F253220 on May 11, 1965, at Los Angeles, California, for a six-week trip to the Dominican Republic, to report on that country. In his application, dated May 11, 1965, at Los Angeles, he indicated that he planned to leave from Miami, Florida, on or about May 11, 1965, via air. This passport was valid for three years' travel to all countries except Albania, Cuba, and those portions of China, Korea and Vietnam under communist control.

He stated that he was born on March 3, 1928, at Juarez, Mexico, and immigrated to the United States in February, 1929. He had lived continuously in the United States, since that date, at El Paso, Texas; San Francisco and Los Angeles, California. He was naturalized on November 27, 1953, at the "Federal Court", El Paso, Texas, and was issued Certificate of Naturalization Number 712072. The file reflects that this certificate was seen and returned to him by the passport authorities. He gave his permanent residence as 16049 East Amber Valley Drive, Whittier, California. His parents were listed as Salvador Salazar, born at Gudalajara, Mexico, February 21, 1898, and Luz Chavez, born at Monterey, Mexico, February 16, 1910. He was last married on May 15, 1959, to Sally Robare, who was born at Los Angeles, California, on January 13, 1933. He requested that his wife, at the above address, be notified in the event of death or accident.

On 11/3/67 the "Los Angeles Times" Information Clerk - Editorial Division, a daily newspaper, Los Angeles, California, advised, and on 12/4/67 reconfirmed, that RUBEN SALAZAR is the "Los Angeles Times" correspondent in Mexico City. SALAZAR maintains offices at Paseo de la Reforma, 122 Cuarto Piso, Mexico, D.F., telephone 356-969. The Information Clerk noted that SALAZAR was in Los Angeles recently but returned to his Mexico City Office and was not due to return to the United States in the immediate future.

It was noted that SALAZAR was one of several persons designated for interview by Assistant Attorney General J. WALTER YEAGLEY.

The above information was furnished the Bureau by re LA let and the case was closed. Re WFO let set forth a suggestion that LA investigate SALAZAR.

LA file 105-23153 revealed current investigation involving a car registered to RUBEN SALAZAR observed in the vicinity of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City.

Since no specific leads involving SALAZAR are outstanding for LA and SALAZAR remains in Mexico, it is recommended this case be closed administratively on this memorandum.

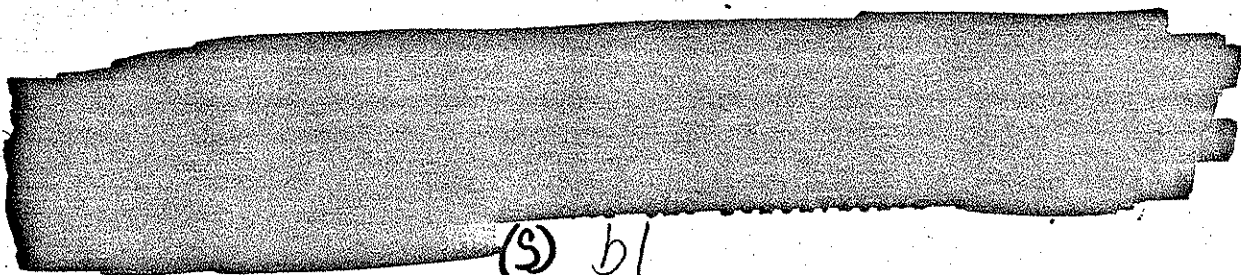

Conference. "FLO KUSHNER, was elected to chair this C.P. activist

"The first point on the agenda was a keynote presentation of the "C.P. Draft Resolution for the 1970 Political Election Final for the State of California"; this was done by BEN DOBBS.

"Some errors are made in this draft Resolution in terms of many things being left out of the Resolution that realy should have been included: This document does not reflect the tremendous unrests in this country; the 1970 Elections are separate from this struggle. There has to be a two fold sharpening struggle around issues in order to create peoples movements on those issues; a tremendous uprising must take place in the U.S. around various issues.

"The Democratic & Republican partys are both a drive to the "Right wing"; we (the C.P.) must work on the unity of issues in order to create a new political party that is concerned with the peoples needs & struggles today: On the question of the Peace & Freedom Party; these struggles must take place in the Peace & Freedom Political Party. A new force must be developed in order to create political independence:

"The C.D.C. is about to give up the Electoral struggle; the C.P. must find ways to raise issues in order to unite the people around vital struggles; so said BEN DOBBS, in his highlights of the draft Resolution of the Southern Calif. District, C.P. - for the State 1970 Election. Note: Before the general discussion from the floor began on the C.P. draft Resolution & BEN DOBBS's, keynote speech; a special report was called for on the Chicano Moratorium & march, which took place August 29, 1970; This report was given by SOL MONROY, in order that this event be tied in with the discussion on the draft Resolution, C.P.; for the 1970, California State Election final.

"SOL MONROY, said that the big question of what is taking place in the Mexican Community? The last National Convention of the C.P., U.S.A., dealt with the growing harassment by the police in the Chicano Community:

"On August 29, 1970; 25,000 people marched on the street in protest of the war. The Chicano Moratorium Committee realy moved people: The "establishment" became worried about this, and had many police on hand to harass these people, but the violence was a secondary question in terms of what the Chicano march realy stood for.

"There were many kinds of people in that march from all over the country; The P.W. did a good job on the march, a copy of the P.W. paper was in the hands of every person on the march & in the Parks.

"A lot of Red-Baiting has taken place since the Chicano March on 8/29/70; this is not new; the Progressive Labor Party (P.L.), caused this kind of Red-baiting in their attempt to create disunity.

"There will be another Chicano Parade Sept. 16, 1970. The Chicano Moratorium Committee, dont want any politicians & no literature nor leaflets distributed on that day; they dont want any cops around: The Sept. 16, 1970 Parade will be a continuation of Aug. 29, 1970 moratorium in celebration of the Independence of Mexico.

"SOL MONROY, said the question of Self defense against violence reflects in various forms in terms of hunger, no jobs, decent housing, equal education & opportunities etc. Repression breeds resistance:

"We ( the C.P.) must demand in mass organizations, that Chicano leaders be allowed to speak at the RUBEN SALAZAR, inquest & give their side of the police violence that took place during the march on Aug. 29, 1970.

"The C.P. can push this issue in order to help the Chicano movement".

"A general discussion followed the reports by BEN DOBBS & SOL MONROY.

"SAM KUSHNER, said the question of what the police did in terms of violence on the Chicano march, is very related to what happened the month of August, in Watts, etc, etc.; this all relate to "Repression" against the Black people & the Chicano people; said SAM KUSHNER."

"Many speakers followed SAM KUSHNER; they spoke in various forms on certain issues, in the same C.P. manner.

"KENDRA ALEXANDER, said that this draft Resolution by

the Southern Calif. District, C.P.; is not clear in any way: The Resolution does not give any specific directions in terms of what to realy do; and most of all this Resolution did not raise the issue of ANGELA DAVIS, who has put her life on the line because she believes in the C.P. & Marxism; and rightly so, but this Resolution reflects a kind of letting down on the problems of Black people".

"BFW DOBBS, summerized the general discussion; he admitted the short-coming of the draft Resolution on various issues, particularly the issue of ANGELA DAVIS, as relate to the struggles of Black people in this country; but said BEN DOBBS, this C.P. draft Resolution of the Southern Calif. District is not the final word."

"Note: LOU DISKIN did not speak.

"The last point on the agenda was a report on the People's World paper & the P.W. Circulation drive for 1000 new P.W. Subscriptions.

"BILL TAYLOR, introduced KATHY OLSON, the new circulation manager of the P.W. in San Francisco, Calif.; she gave the major report on the P.W. new subscription drive on the West Coast, in terms of putting the P.W. paper in every hand in the Community through the new circulation drive for the P.W.

"Note: KATHY OLSON's report is reflected in the Orange colored leaflet that is included with this report; which is refered to - Dear Comrades: At the heading. No discussion followed this report."

represent a moderate organization, I do not represent an Uncle Tom as I said to you a moment ago, I'm an angry young man and I'm an angry young man because of some of the issues involved today which cause me to feel that the country is not living up to the concept of democracy as applied to Black people or Mexican Americans.

And I feel that when they call upon me to repeat the words, "I pledge allegiance to the flag, when it gets to that part, under liberty and justice for all" I couldn't.
