

On 11/3/67 the "Los Angeles Times" Information Clerk - Editorial Division, a daily newsparer, Los Angeles, California, advised, and on 12/1/67 reconfirmed, that RUBEN SALAZAR is the "Los Angeles Times" correspondent in Mexico City. SALAZAR maintains offices at Paseo de la Reforma, 122 Cuarto Piso, Nexico, D.F., telephone 356-969. The Information Clerk noted that SALAZAR was in Los Angeles recently but returned to his Mexico City Office and was not due to return to the United States in the immediate future.

It was noted that SALAZAR was one of several persons designated for interview by Assistant Attorney General J. WALTER YEAGLEY.

The above information was furnished the Bureau by re LA let and the case was closed. Re WFO let set forth a suggestion that LA investigate SALAZAR .

LA file 105-23153 revealed current investigation involving a car registered to RUBEN SALAZAR observed in the vicinity of the Cuban Babassy in Mexico City.

Since no specific leads involving SALAZAR are outstanding for LA and SALAZAR

This meeting was held to protest the killing of Ruben Salazar, the alleged police brutality during the August 29, Chicano Moratorium demonstration, and alleged repression of the Mexican people. The meeting was held between 8.p.m. and 10:30 p.m. There was a \$2. admission donation. In addition to this Don Wheeldin made a pitch for more funds during the meeting. It is not known how much was collected.

Speakers included: Corky Gonzales, who said that the Mexican people would take over the stores, schools, and businesses, and would nationalize the community, for their own benefit.

Doris Walker, National President of the National Lawyers Guild. She said the legal system of the United States is unjust and that it must be changed.



Marque Neal, one of the speakers, read a poem he wrote called "August 29."

John Williams, official from the Teamsters' union (belived to be from Local 208) said he supported the Chicano struggle and he disagrees with his union in its conflict with Cesar Chavez and the UFWOC. Williams said he supports Cesar Chavez.

Irving SArnoff said we must struggle for peace and also change the economic system of the U.S. so that all people will have freedom and equality.




