The Subject stated that he acquired fifty-one photographs in September, 1952 from [REDACTED] who took the photographs immediately after a riot at the POW compounds after General DODD was released and General BOATNER had taken over command of the island. At the time the pictures were purchased from [REDACTED] for \$5.00, [REDACTED] was assigned to the same unit as the Subject. The Subject stated that [REDACTED] is still in the Korean area assigned to the 7th M. F. Service Company, APO 59. The Subject stated that it was his recollection that the film was developed in the United States by [REDACTED] and twenty-one sets of the prints were sent to [REDACTED] who sells the sets for \$5.00 per set. The Subject stated that he knows of only two other individuals who have purchased sets of the pictures, namely [REDACTED] and RUBEN SALAZAR. The Subject stated that both of these men were recently discharged from the service, and stated that [REDACTED]'s home address is Dallas, Texas, and SALAZAR's home address is either Los Angeles or San Francisco, California.

DOD 1. FOLLOWING IS SUMMARY OF PRINCIPAL ARTICLES IN ISSUE NUMBER
 NIC 6 SINH VINH HUE (HUE STUDENTS) DATED NOV 4, WHICH APPEARED ON
 AID NEWSSTANDS 6 NOV:

RSR 2. LONGEST AND MOST INTERESTING ARTICLE, ALLEGEDLY EXTRACTED FROM HANH TRINH MAGAZINE NUMBERS 7 AND 8, REVIEWS VIETNAMESE HISTORY FROM 1946 TO PRESENT. AMERICANS PRAISED FOR HELPING OUST FRENCH, BUT CHASTIZED BOTH FOR SUPPORTING DIEM DICTATORSHIP AND FOR CAUSING ITS DOWNFALL THROUGH USURPATION OF VIETNAMESE SOVEREIGNTY (SIC). AFTER DIEM, US USED COLONIALIST TACTICS OF DIVIDING PEOPLE INTO HOSTILE GROUPS (CATHOLICS-BUDDHISTS, SOUTHERNERS-NORTHERNERS, MILITARY-CIVILIAN, ETC.) IN ORDER TO RULE THEM. AS US POWER AND USURPATION GROWS, VC STRUGGLE APPEARS MORE "RIGHTEOUS", AS FIGHT AGAINST INTERVENTION AND INVASION OF FOREIGNERS AS WELL AS

AGAINST CORRUPT, DICTATORIAL REGIME. NOW, INSTEAD OF AMERICANS ADVISING VIETNAMESE IN FIGHT AGAINST VC, VIETNAMESE HAVE BECOME MERE AMERICAN ASSISTANTS IN FIGHT. IN ORDER OVERCOME THIS SORRY STATE OF AFFAIRS, PATRIOTIC NATIONALISTS MUST (1) BECOME ACTIVE IN STRUGGLE AGAINST COMMUNISTS, FRENCH COLONISTS AND "US IMPERIALISTS". (2) RESOLVE "OUTMODED PREJUDICES" SUCH AS "OPPOSITION BETWEEN NATIONALISTS AND COMMUNISTS"; (3) FORM STRONG NON-COMMUNISTS FORCE WHICH CAN MAKE DIRECT CONTACT WITH COMMUNISTS. FINALLY, US WILL NOT TOLERATE "SOCIALISM" AND SEEKS MAKE VIETNAM "NEW

KIND OF COLONY." VIETNAM MUST HAVE "NON-COMMUNIST SOCIALISM."

3. CONTINUATION LAST WEEK'S ARTICLE ON "FREEDOM A HUMAN DIGNITY" ASKS US AND VIETNAMESE AUTHORITIES TO TAKE ACTION TO STOP MISBEHAVIOR US TROOPS AND PREVENT OTHER CITIES FROM BECOMING LIKE DA NANG, CAM RANH. "HUMAN DIGNITY" OF VIETNAMESE PEOPLE BEING SUBVERTED BY AMERICANS, WHO DO NOT RESPECT VIETNAM AND ITS PEOPLE, AND UNLESS SOMETHING DONE SOON "PEOPLE" WILL RISE AGAINST GVN AND CHANGE PRESENT RELATIONS BETWEEN US AND VIETNAM. US MAY HELP VIETNAM FIGHT FOR FREEDOM, BUT HUMAN DIGNITY EVEN MORE IMPORTANT THAN FREEDOM.

4. "LETTERS TO AMERICAN FRIEND" COMMENDS UNITED STATES FOR HELPING OVERTHROW DIEM, BUT SAYS THAT AFTER 1 NOV 1963 COUP, US "OVERTHREW THOSE WHO WERE SUPPORTED BY THE PEOPLE" AND BEGAN CAMPAIGN, WHICH STILL GOING ON, "AGAINST THOSE WHO MADE NOVEMBER 1 COUP POSSIBLE." LETTER WARNS THAT AMERICANS WILL BE HATED WHEN THEY "AGAINST ASPIRATIONS OF LOCAL PEOPLE".

5. "STUDENTS NOTEBOOK" CASTIGATES US FOR BOMBING OF DMZ AND VILLAGE IN BINH DINH, IMPLYING THESE INCIDENTS NOT REALLY MISTAKES. OTHER "NOTEBOOK" ARTICLES COMPLAIN ABOUT ECONOMIC SITUATION; SNEER AT SAIGON STUDENT UNION; AND SPECULATE THAT GENERAL THI MAY SOON OVERTHROW KY GOVT.

6. COMMENT: THIS ISSUE CONTINUES PAPER'S RECENT TREND OF INCREASING ANTI-AMERICANISM AND VEILED BUT OBVIOUS NEUTRALISM. MORE SPACE, IN CONTRAST TO EARLIER ISSUES, DEVOTED TO CRITICISM OF AMERICANS THAN ANY OTHER SUBJECT.

3. THE ELECTORAL TRIBUNAL ORDERED THAT SEVERAL SPECIFIED VOTING TABLES IN PANAMA CITY REMAIN OPEN UNTIL 1900 HOURS, TWO HOURS PAST THE REGULAR CLOSING TIME, PRESUMABLY IN ORDER TO COMPENSATE FOR THE LATE OPENING OF THOSE TABLES. COUNTING

BOTH TV-2 (SUPPORTING ARIAS) AND TV-4 (SUPPORTING SAMUDIO) REPORTED THAT TWO AMERICAN NEWSMEN, RUBEN SALAZAR OF THE LOS ANGELES TIMES AND HENRY WILKINSON OF THE NEW YORK TIMES, WERE STOPPED IN PANAMA BY A GROUP OF "HOODLUMS" WHO BRANDISHED REVOLVERS AND CONFISCATED THEIR CAMERAS. BOTH STATIONS CLAIMED THAT THE "HOODLUMS" BELONGED TO THE OTHER POLITICAL CAMP.
