At its First Conference in Havana in August 1967, it announced its goals as the promotion of guerrilla warfare and revolution in Latin America; support of the Negro "revolution" in the United States; and creation of a continent-wide organization with its seat in Havana.

Articles appearing in the LOS ANGELES TIMES indicate that SALAZAR covered the OLAS Conference.

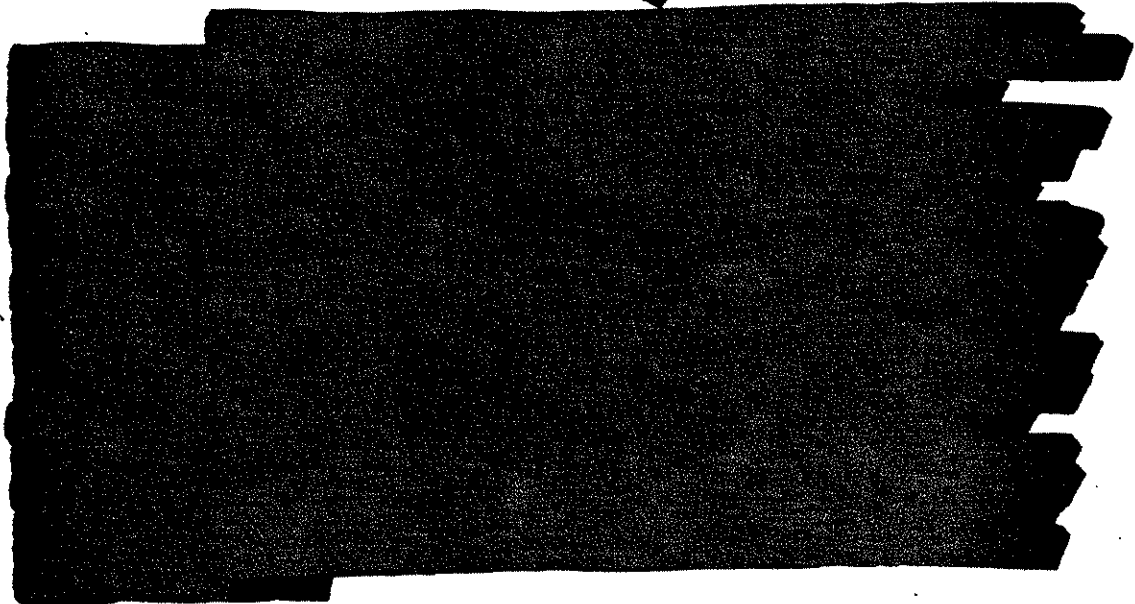
On August 17, 1955, a large spread appeared in the El Paso Herald-Post on the front page setting out that "LA NACHA" known as the border queen sold one "papel" (paper) of heroin for \$5. This newspaper continued to refer to "LA NACHA" as dope queen of the border, and a photograph of "LA NACHA" whose true name is IGNACIA JASSO, was set forth along with a photograph of the street in Juarez, Mexico, where she resides. This newspaper article pointed out that "Herald-Post" reporter RUBEN SALAZAR accompanied a narcotics addict whom he called "HYPO" to the home of "LA NACHA" where on two occasions they bought a "papel" of heroin for \$5. This reporter in his article pointed out that "LA NACHA" lived in a very luxurious home which is located on the corner of the alley and Violeta Street, Juarez, Mexico. The article went on to advise that the newspaper reporter also met "LA NACHA's" daughter and son and was present at the time "HYPO" made his purchases of heroin. *Mexico*

On May 5, 1955, a reporter named RUBEN SALAZAR for the El Paso Herald-Post, pretending he was drunk, was successful in getting himself arrested and thrown into the El Paso City Jail which over the past several years has been the object of criticism because of its unsavory manner in which it has been operated for the past several years. On May 9, 1955, headlines blazed in the El Paso Herald-Post as to conditions in the El Paso City Jail as found by reporter RUBEN SALAZAR who was booked under the name of ROBERTO SANCHEZ. TEXAS SALAZAR spent a night and a day in Tank No. 6 and this is what he saw:

1. City Jail prisoners hardened by repeated convictions for dope addiction held an all night narcotics party.
2. Man in a dope frenzy. No interruption by police.

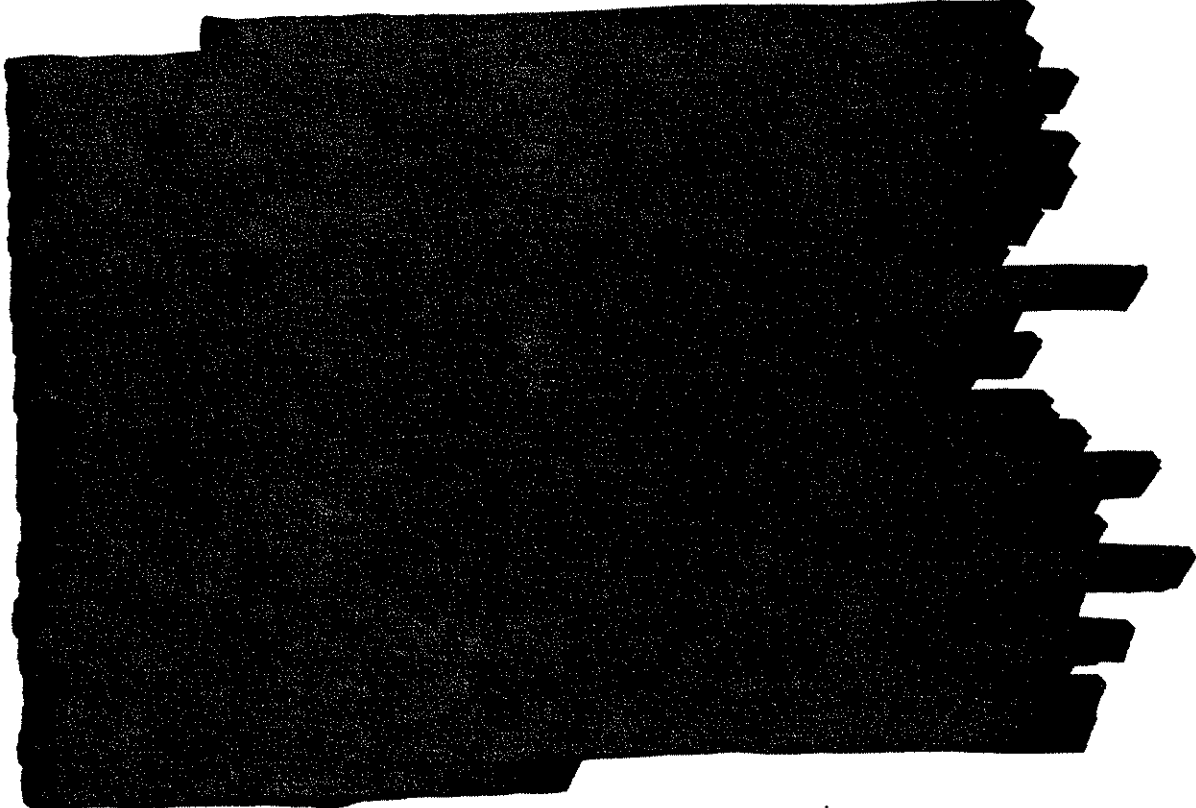
3. Illegal package smuggled to a dope addict during an evening meal and addict in his cell in preparation for the night's party.

4. Prisoners threatened and beaten by red headed, hopped up leader of City Jail's notorious Tank No. 6.

The El Paso Herald-Post referred to Tank No. 6 in the City Jail as, "The City's Chamber of Horrors".

*b7c* The Foreign Broadcast Information Service has prepared a Special Memorandum dated 8-9-67 concerning [REDACTED]'s activities and statements abroad.

*b7c* The Internal Security Division of the Department has advised that the statements in this memorandum, attributed to [REDACTED] while in Havana, Cuba, generally reflect a more revolutionary and seditious approach than any of his reported statements in this country.

*b7c* By a memorandum dated 8-30-67, the Internal Security Division of the Department set out excerpts of certain statements made by [REDACTED] which appear in the Special Memorandum. The Department requested that investigation be conducted to determine whether there is available any sound recording of any of these statements and whether there are available any witnesses who could testify concerning these statements.

*b7c* In this regard the Department furnished a list of American journalists who were reportedly in Havana, Cuba, during [REDACTED]'s stay there.

Interview of journalists presents the possibility of embarrassment. Some of these individuals have subversive backgrounds and/or have been uncooperative with the Bureau in the past. In view of this, these persons are not being considered for interview.

The pertinent field offices are being requested to submit recommendations for interviews of the remaining journalists which are set out below. Upon receipt of the field offices' recommendations and if the Bureau is in agreement, the names of those persons recommended will be submitted to the Department to determine if the Department wants those journalists interviewed concerning this matter.

LA T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on August 6, 1970, that the captioned event would be held in East Los Angeles on August 29, 1970, to protest the number of Mexican-Americans killed in Viet Nam. The source stated that the moratorium is sponsored by an Ad Hoc Committee, made up of Mexican-Americans from various groups and from all walks of life in the Los Angeles area. The moratorium would consist of a march and rally.

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On August 27, 1970, Special Agents of the FBI made the following observations during a demonstration held in the vicinity of the Los Angeles Music Center on that date:

The demonstration was planned to coincide with the appearance of President Richard Nixon and several Cabinet officials at the Music Center. At approximately 5:30 PM, some 100 individuals formed an orderly picket line on the sidewalk across from the Music Center. The marchers, at times dressed in black clothing, carried "Gloria Payer" and carried signs

reading "The Chicano killed for every white", "Stop Chicano Genocide Today", and "Mr. Nixon, is your face worth our sons' lives?".

The picket line increased to approximately 200-300 people by 6:30 PM, at which time President Nixon and his party arrived. They were escorted into the Music Center without incident.

The picket line consisted of mostly Mexican-Americans, many of whom were "hippy-type" individuals. Some individuals identified in the picket line were

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Also observed were

The picket line dispersed after the President entered the Music Center, and by 7:00 PM, no demonstrators remained on the scene.

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NATIONAL CHICANO MORATORIUM

On August 29, 1970, LA T-1 advised as follows:

Demonstrators began gathering at Belvedere Park in East Los Angeles at approximately 10:30 AM, August 29, 1970. The scheduled plans were to march through several East Los Angeles streets, a distance of approximately five miles, to another park, where a rally was to be held. At 11:00 AM, the actual march began from Belvedere Park with approximately 4,000-5,000 participants. The march proceeded east on Beverly Boulevard to Atlantic Boulevard, then south on Atlantic to Whittier. The marchers occupied the entire width of the various streets, and at 12:00 noon, the line of march was approximately 1/2 mile in length, and in some places, 20 abreast. At 12:30 PM, the marchers had turned west on Whittier Boulevard.

The entire march route was patrolled by Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office (LACSO) Deputies, and the LACSO helicopters directed the officers' activities.

The sidewalks along the way were sometimes crowded with on-lookers, some of whom joined in the march. During the course of the march, smoke bombs were set off by unidentified demonstrators.

As marchers proceeded west on Whittier Boulevard, they became more disorderly and at approximately 1:25 PM, some fights broke out along the parade route and some individuals in the crowd began sporadic throwing of rocks and bottles at officers and their vehicles. The crowd continued to grow more disorderly, and by 2:45 PM, there was widespread throwing of rocks and bottles in the areas adjacent to Laguna Park, at Whittier and Alhambra. LACSO officers were injured, and vehicles were damaged. At approximately 3:00 PM, LAPD squads were called in to assist the LACSO Deputies.

Between 3:00 PM, and 4:30 PM, many fires were started in the area, and numerous buildings were burned. LACSO Deputies then blocked off all traffic into the area. By 6:00 PM, most of the crowd had dispersed into small groups, but they remained in the general area, and caused damage to buildings and vehicles.

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NATIONAL CHICANO MOVEMENT

Many arrests were made, and one individual was shot by LACSO Deputies when he tried to run them down in his car. Both LACSO and LAPD were fully mobilized, and placed on Tactical Alert, with field command posts.

At 10:15 PM, LA T-1 advised that since 6:00 PM, no further incidents had occurred, although LACSO Deputies had withdrawn to the perimeter of the troubled area, and widespread looting was taking place along a 10 to 12 block area of Whittier Boulevard.

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The source advised further that one of these arrests was [REDACTED] Source did not know details of the arrest at this time.

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On August 30, 1970, at approximately 12:00 midnight, the troubled area was relatively quiet, and LACSO and LAPD officers were closely patrolling the area.

As of 12:00 noon, on August 30, 1970, LA T-1 advised that Ruben Salazar, a Los Angeles Times correspondent, is the only known fatality to date. The source stated that LACSO Deputies responded to a call that there were individuals with guns at the Silver Dollar Bar, 4945 Whittier Boulevard. The deputies ordered everyone to exit the bar, and when there was no response, tear gas was fired into the bar. When deputies entered the building, they found Salazar had been fatally wounded in the head by a tear gas shell.

LA T-1 further advised 25 citizens had reportedly been treated for minor injuries, and that 152 arrests had been made, 32 for misdemeanors and 60 for felonies. Twenty-eight LACSO Deputies have been injured, and three are serious enough to require hospitalization, although their exact condition is not known.
