As pointed out in enclosed Press Release, Sheriff PETER J. PITCHESS (a personal friend of MEYER), Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office (LACSO), has been furnishing MEYER with complete reports of the LACSO investigation. Also Assistant U. S. Attorneys attended the coroner's inquest (regarding SALAZAR's death) on a daily basis.

In accordance with instructions set forth in the Manual of Instructions, Section 27D (2), no action is being taken by the Los Angeles Office, UACB. It is recommended no investigation be conducted in view of the above, particularly since no useful purpose would be served other than offsetting any possible criticism of the USA.
